

How Can I Reduce My Potential Exposure to Proposition 65 Chemicals from Power Water Blasting Equipment?

- Avoid breathing in exhaust from engines and onboard generators.
- Try not to idle engines, where possible
- Whenever practical, do not stand next to engines and onboard generators when they are running. Distance yourself from the source of the exhaust.
- Service the engine in a well-ventilated area. Perform regular maintenance and frequent tune-ups.
- When refueling your unit, avoid skin contact with the fuel and stand a
 few steps away from the nozzle to reduce exposure to any fuel vapors
 that might be released into the air.
- Use alternatives to lead paint.
- Wear gloves, protective clothing and eye protection when servicing or maintaining the equipment.
- Wash your hands before preparing or eating food after operating the equipment.
